A WORD FROM THE HEADTEACHER

What a wonderful start to our new academic year here at Loseley. Thank you to all our parents for sending the children back to school in smart school uniform for the start of the academic year; I am always so proud to see how well they have turned out with their smart newly polished shoes.

It has been particularly lovely to welcome so many new families to our school this year. We all look forward to sharing the next seven years with you and your family as your children travel through our wonderful school, growing and developing as young learners along the way. Our new Reception children have settled remarkably well into the new routines of school. They are now keenly taking part in their daily phonics lessons, and it won't be long until you get to experience that remarkable joy when they understand that the print in books makes stories that they can read.

Following the summer term and summer holiday building work, I am pleased to be able to tell you that the refurbishment of the bottom of the blue block is now finished. This provides us with a new learning space for children to use who may require additional social and emotional support to help ensure strong inclusion in their classes. In this space we have built a high-tech sensory room which really helps us to extend our already strong inclusive practice across the school. Across the school, in the main building, we had less glamorous but very necessary heating work completed across the summer break. This updated heating pipes and radiators in many of the classrooms. This work took all summer to complete and so I would like to thank the staff who all had to work very hard at the end of the holidays to get the school open and ready for the children's return to school.

A polite reminder to parents please about ensuring that you arrive punctually to school each morning. The first session of the day is always reading across the school and arriving late really impacts your child's ability to settle to routine and morning learning. To ensure safety on our school site and in our community, please can parents not use the staff carpark at all unless you have been given specific permission as a blue badge holder. Can I ask that you also park safely on our neighbouring streets to be respectful of our local residents but also so that children have clear lines of sight for crossing roads. Thank you for your support with this.
