Term: Autumn 1	Topic Title: My school and me!	
<p><u>Homework – Literacy</u> Think of your favourite fairy-tale. Draw a picture of one of the characters and what happens to them.</p> 	<p><u>Homework – Literacy</u> One of the stories we are reading is Little Red Riding Hood. Draw a picture of her journey through the woods. Add labels to describe this. Write a sentence to say how she is feeling?</p> 	<p><u>Homework – Literacy</u> Make up your own fairy-tale. Who is the main character? What happens to them? How does your story end? Don't forget to use our story words!</p> <p><i>Once upon a time... one day... unfortunately... luckily... finally</i></p>
<p><u>Homework – Maths</u> Create a number line to 20 with numbers and pictures or objects.</p> 	<p><u>Homework – Maths</u> Complete the maths worksheet.</p> 	<p><u>Homework – Maths</u> Make a calendar with the days of the week. Add the different things you do each day.</p> 
<p><u>Homework – Topic</u> Draw or make a collage picture of your body and label the parts. Don't forget to add the features of the face. Think what part of your body you use for each sense.</p> 	<p><u>Homework – Topic</u> Draw a map of your route to school. What landmarks do you pass on the way? Draw these on your map and label them.</p> 	<p><u>Homework – Topic</u> Talk to a grandparent, elderly relative or neighbour about what life was like when they were children. Maybe they have some photos they can share with you. What was the same and what was different from the way you live now? Write down some of the facts that you found out.</p>
<p><u>Home Learning Activities</u> Create a journey stick. Begin your walk by finding a long stick and starting from the top, tie different things that you find on the way on to it with string. Tell your family about your walk by describing the things on your stick.</p> 	<p><u>Home Learning Activities</u> Bake some cakes or biscuits. Maybe you could make gingerbread men like the one in the traditional tale. Don't forget to measure the ingredients carefully. How could you decorate them? Don't worry if you can't do this one- we will be baking at school soon.</p>	<p><u>Home Learning Activities</u> Explore your garden or go on an autumn walk and collect as many different types of autumn leaves as you can. Make some leaf rubbings, or a picture with them.</p> 
<p><u>Citizenship Tasks</u> Help keep our community tidy. Go for a litter pick in your street or local park with an adult. Make sure you pick things up safely. Wear gloves to protect your hands and don't pick up anything sharp.</p>	<p><u>Citizenship Tasks</u> Take some of the cakes or biscuits that you made around to an elderly neighbour. Stay and chat with them and find out about what they like doing and what they know about where you live.</p>	<p><u>Citizenship Tasks</u> Help look after our local wildlife. Perhaps you could build a hedgehog house or bug hotel in your garden or leave food out for the birds (or those hedgehogs!)</p>
