Talk about the properties of quadrilaterals using the vocabulary parallel and perpendicular.</p>	<p><b>Homework – Maths</b>                      Calculator Zap                      Put a 2-, 3- or 4-digit number into the calculator.                      Take turns turning each digit to a 0 until you have nothing left.</p>	<p><b>Homework – Maths</b>                      Write the alphabet using capital letters and identify how many lines of symmetry there are in each letter.</p>
<p><b>Homework – Science</b>                      We have been learning about what makes a living thing – MRS NERG. Can you find some examples of things that were once living e.g. pine cones, cotton thread, paper? You can draw them or take photographs of them. How have they changed? How do you know they are no longer living?</p>	<p><b>Homework – Topic</b>                      Research the sorts of animals that lived in the Kingdom of Benin. Remember it is a forest kingdom – what sort of animals live in the African rainforests? Which were the most important to the people of Benin? Draw detailed pictures and label them.</p> 	<p><b>Homework – Topic</b>                      Can you design your own Benin bronze? Look at the typical subject matter and some of the symbols used, then design your own. You could even paint it bronze!</p>
