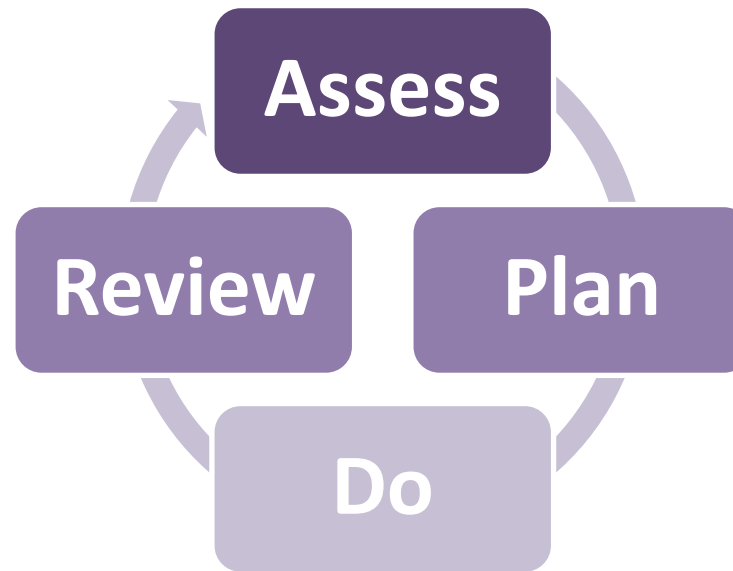


Loseley Fields Primary School Provision Map 2020-2021

COVID-19 UPDATE: During the COVID-19 pandemic, please be reassured that our children will still receive the level of support that they require but in light of this, we may need to make reasonable adjustments to our provision. This may include meetings between staff, parents and professionals being held online rather than in person, training held online for staff and any other measures that are necessary. Despite the barriers put in place by COVID-19, we aim to provide the right support for each and every one of our children in the school. Teaching Assistants will still be able to carry out interventions in their year group bubbles maintaining social distance and the use of visors.

All staff working with children at Loseley Fields Primary School will follow the **Graduated Response**:



Provision in school is organised into three waves of intervention:

Universal – Wave 1 All children have access to inclusive high-quality teaching at Loseley Fields.

Targeted – Wave 2 Some children will need additional programmes and/or planned support, designed to accelerate learning. This may include additional, time-limited, tailored intervention support programmes.

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Specialist – Wave 3 Additional highly personalised interventions which may include one to one or specialist interventions.
