Geography: The Amazon

- Use atlases, maps and globes to locate South America and the Amazon
- To use basic geographical vocabulary to describe geographical features of a region and compare to the UK.
- To name and describe animals and plants found in the Amazon

Science: Plants and Living Things

- Explore the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive
- Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited.
- Identify how living things depend on each other.
- Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats.
- Find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.
- Understand the stages in a life cycle of plants and a frog.
- Classify plants and animals according to their characteristics.
